Front playground drainage issues solved (we hope!)

We are very grateful to the team at Yorkshire Water for working with us to find a solution to the flooding in our banking around the front playground. After years of dealing with significant leaks onto the bridle path and into our playground, Yorkshire Water have, we hope, helped us to solve this and you may have noticed that the playground is now dry and the 'River Baxter' (as we called it!) running down past the entrance to school is no longer! We have made plans with the team to put in additional measures to prevent any further problems and to also investigate further exactly why we have such a large quantity of rainwater flowing through our drainage system (this comes from land and housing above school) so we hope to have a long-term solution to the significant problems we faced after any rainfall. Thanks Yorkshire Water for your determination and superb problem solving!



Dogs

Thank you for respecting our rule that no dogs (no matter how small or how cute!) are allowed in our school site at pick up or drop-off times.

Design & Technology

In Design and Technology lessons, we aim to equip our pupils with the confidence to become innovative and resourceful problem-solvers and designers.

Year 4 and year 6 were keen to share the results of their recent Design and Technology projects. In year 4, the focus has been on designing and making a cushion. There was much to learn in this project including different stitching styles which you can see the children took great care with and how to add applique details to their designs. These look superb Year 4!

In Year 6, children have been focused on mechanisms used to move and manage water including looking at the design for the Archimedes screw. They were then set a practical challenge to design a 'water wall' for younger children to use. Just look at these results - carefully placed funnels and tubing and real attention to design features to appeal to younger children. These have been installed and are being enjoyed by Reception children. Well done year 6!
