#### Spotlight on.....Visits in the Art Curriculum

As part of our Art curriculum, we make sure that all children experience at least two high quality Art-related visits during their time with us. We are very lucky in West Yorkshire to have two nationally-renowned galleries/Art spaces to visit: The Hepworth Art Gallery in Wakefield and the Yorkshire Sculpture Park in Bretton. Year 6 recently enjoyed visiting the Hepworth Gallery – a modern Art gallery where our students strengthened their classroom learning about the work of Barbara Hepworth as well as visiting other artists' exhibitions. They used watercolours to paint flowers 'en plein air' (just like the impressionist artists they study) and showed off their sculpture skills by making clay sculptures which, as you can see, are beautifully and thoughtfully made.





Yesterday, our year 1 artists spent a sunny day at the Yorkshire Sculpture Park learning to discuss and express their thoughts about different pieces of Art and created their own sculptures from natural found objects and plasticine.

### Story stones in Reception

Sometimes, Forest school is a place for wild adventure and other times, for more peaceful, reflective activities. This week, Reception children have been making story stones and telling stories to the forest school group linking in with their topic of Stories from the past and oral story telling.

#### SAFEGUARDING

Drowning Prevention Week (DPW) is one of the largest summer water safety campaigns across the UK and Ireland.

It runs from 15th to 22nd June.

No child should drown, and with the right water safety education – such as knowledge of the Water Safety Code – accidental drownings are preventable.

Drowning Prevention Week is deliberately timed ahead of the school summer holidays when children spend more time outdoors and when vital water safety skills can help keep children safe.

In our school, children have swimming lessons in year 5 and we include water safety in all our lessons.

Our curriculum is carefully crafted to ensure that learning starts in the earliest years and is built on step by step as children progress through school.








## **New for September 2024!**
