Staff CPD

This year staff at school took part in a 2 hr CPD session covering aspects of the cricket curriculum, which is taught to children in years 1 -6.

This session covered:

- Correct use and implementation of underarm and overarm throwing technique.
- Fielding technique including a variety of drills and small sided games.
- Initial and intermediate teaching of overarm bowling.
- Batting technique which included correct grip, stance, forward and backward defensive and attacking strokes.
- An understanding of skills progression throughout the year groups.
- Setup and management of small group games including safety tips.
- Setup and management of larger group games.

School Games

The School Games programme this year has not been as broad in scope as it was last year. Events that we attended last year weren't offered as part of the programme.

We have also faced significant challenges transporting the children to and from events due to the lack of a school minibus, and with the weather causing several events to be cancelled.

The winners of the award this year have been:

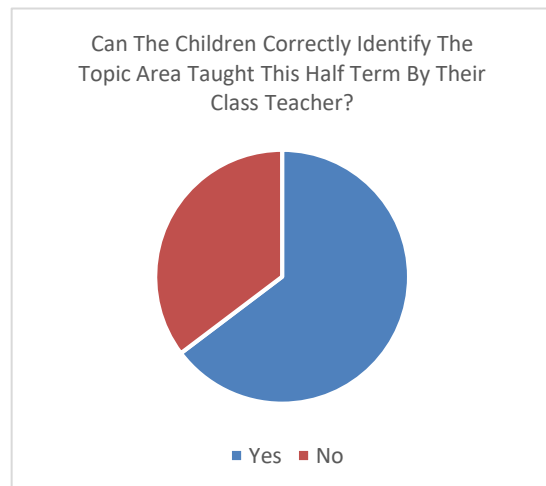
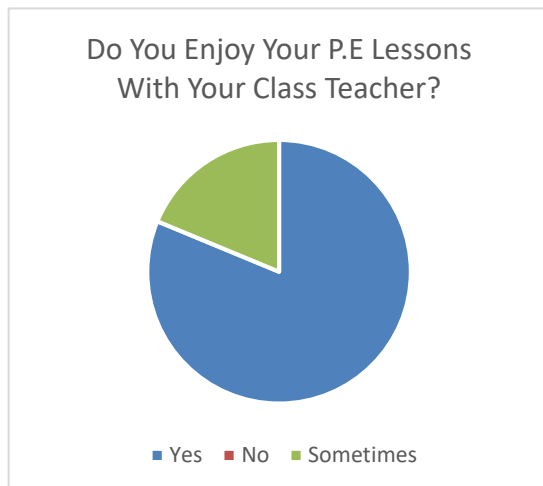

Pupil monitoring was undertaken in November this year and has included a cross section of children from year 2 to year 6, including children with SEND and in receipt of Pupil Premium.

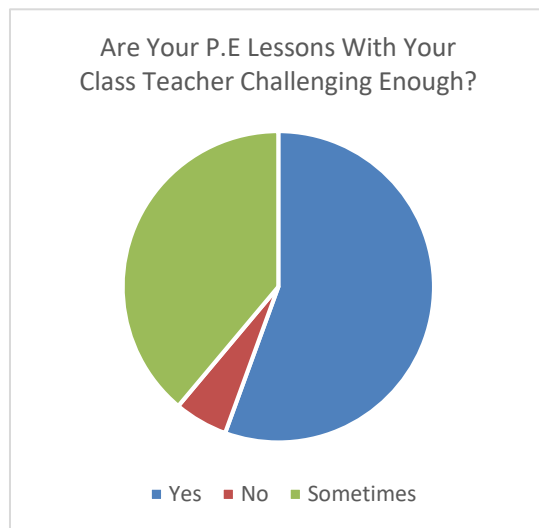
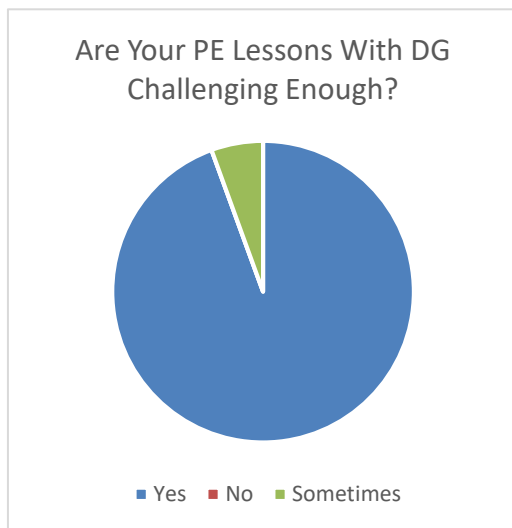
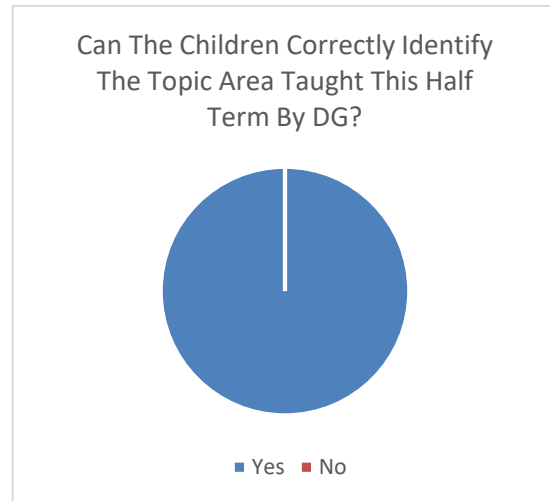
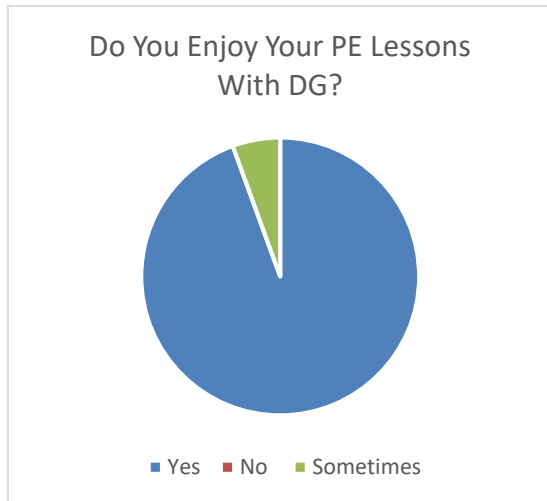
The focus of the survey was to gauge:

- The level of enjoyment during both P.E specialist and teacher led lessons.
- To ascertain the level of challenge during both weekly P.E lessons.
- To make sure the children have a clear understanding of the learning objectives/ topic area during each P.E lesson.
- To gauge the frequency of class teacher led lessons. Are these lessons happening on a weekly basis as planned?
- To find out if the children are happy with the P.E provision at Northowram. Is there anything they specifically dislike or would change?





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Overall, the children the children we surveyed seem extremely happy with the P.E provision in school, with very few expressing any desire for major change to the curriculum or delivery of subject.

A sample of comments made by the children surveyed:

"I don't like it when we do it outside in the cold"

"I wouldn't change anything – I enjoy it all"

"I don't like when I have to miss some of my P.E because of my piano lesson"

"Getting changed and going out in the rain"

"I don't like going outside to do P.E when it's cold"

"I wouldn't change anything really"

"I really enjoy doing P.E"

"I'd like more football in P.E"
